


Our goal for this call:

Origins of the HEAR CSO Consortium

Diverse groups united by the recognition that:

- Climate change, funding shortages, ongoing and emergent outbreaks and pandemics pose grave challenges the current global health architecture.
- Discussions and decisions about future directions are ongoing now.
- These processes will not be complete, effective or bold without civil society input.

Objective of the HEAR CSO Consortium

With support from Wellcome Trust and partnership from global collaborators, HEAR CSO Consortium aims to:

Support communities and civil society working across sectors and issues around the world to develop ideas, aspirations and substantive proposals to inform diverse convenings on global health architecture.

Our working definition

By global health architecture, we mean the systems, structures, institutions, rules and processes that collectively **guide**, **coordinate**, **finance** and **implement** efforts to improve health on a global scale.

Guidance and Governance

Relates to how a health system is governed, and focus on issues such as policy authority, organizational authority, commercial authority, professional authority and about how stakeholders are involved in health systems decisions and on what terms. Also informs approaches to cross-border externalities such as disease surveillance and information sharing

Coordination of Global Public Goods Access

Development of new health products, international norms and standards, IP, knowledge generation and sharing, global surveillance, policy and implementation research, market shaping, risk shifting

Financing

Relates to how finances flow through health systems, and focus on how systems are financed, types of funding organizations, how to remunerate providers, how products and services are purchased and the incentive structures for consumers

Implementation and Delivery

Relates to how health services are delivered, accessed and catered to meet local priorities, and focus on factors that determine how care is designed to meet consumers' needs, by whom care is provided, where care is provided and with the supports used to those providing and receiving care

Our approach to inclusive, global work

Core principles:

- **Accessibility and Inclusion:** We ask about and strive to meet the large majority of needs for interpretation, captioning and translated materials for all of our convenings, gathering input from invitees and assessing our own responsiveness.
- **Inclusiveness:** We have multiple formats for engagement including virtual, synchronous consultations, a survey, 1:1 conversations, and national engagements. Across these, we seek to ensure participation of groups working across health topics and domains of global health architecture, looking closely at levels of influence and access to visible power.
- **Polyvocal, not Prescriptive:** There are many possible preferred futures for global health. HEAR CSO will not generate a single consensus statement, but rather a living repository of resources, reflections and visions.

Our planned activities

1. Consultations

- 2 global consultations; 10 regional virtual consultations
- Up to 4 national engagements – focused on bringing marginalized and under-represented voices, addressing local, context-specific barriers to participation
- A global survey

2. Amplification of CSO voices and views on global health architecture

- Host a living repository of readouts from our consultations

3. Resource sharing

- Keep updated calendar of ongoing relevant processes, a compendium of links to various surveys circulating for regional inputs, and links to opportunities to comment on and review outputs

Our approach to alignment with ongoing processes

- Map and track multi stakeholder processes
- Assess feasibility and relevance of a civil society-only convening prior to one or more planned multi stakeholder events
- Strategically convene consultations timed such that outputs can support CSOs in planned processes and more broadly.
- Share and respond to requests for resources
- Support connections between and visibility of CSOs who are engaging in or advancing their own activities

Our evolving calendar

Week of 20 Oct: HEAR CSO Asia Pacific regional consultation #1 and HEAR CSO sub-Saharan Africa consultation #1

Week of 27 Oct: HEAR CSO Latin American and Caribbean regional consultation #1

3-5 November: Wellcome Africa regional consultation

4-6 Nov: Wellcome Asia Pacific regional consultation

12-13 Nov: Wellcome LAC regional consultation

Week of 20 November: HEAR CSO Eastern Europe and Central Asia Region consultation #1 and Global consultation #1

December 1: HEAR CSO Survey launch

January-March 2026: 5 regional, 1 global virtual consultation, national engagements and survey distribution

March-May: Validation and deepening work

June: Final synthesis report

Initial readouts from consultations will be available for participants 3-5 working days after the convening and shared on-line following participant validation.

Regional groupings for 2025 consultations are aligned to Wellcome Trust-supported multistakeholder convenings. 2026 consultations may reconfigure or separate geographies.
